## PRINCIPAL

### Learning Highlights

We have had a lot to deal with this term and sometimes good old-fashioned teaching and learning may seem to take a back seat. Not so! Read on...

- Year 5-6 children completed an excellent, challenging and instructive camp at Bridge Valley last week. A real focus was on challenge and cooperation.
- Stu Duval, author and illustrator, visited two weeks ago and worked with all children on developing ideas for art and literacy. The result has been a flowering of excellent writing and illustration among our children.
- Children across the school have been involved in thanking the many schools, individuals and organisations that helped us through the fire and evacuation. Writing cards, making pictures and sending messages have taught children about how to express gratitude and celebrate overcoming obstacles.
- The No Child Left Inside physical activity programme continues with Y0- 4 and a selection of Y5 children.
- Tui team (year 2-3) visited the museum to explore the Life Before Dinosaurs - Permian Monsters exhibition, and are using this experience to launch a major science study.
- Speaking of science, we held a very successful science discovery morning for the whole school. This has been a springboard for science projects across the school, including a study of light by Toroa (yr 3-4).
- Student leaders are active across our committees, student council and other roles. Leaders learn how to take responsibility, organise themselves and others, plan and run events, mediate challenging behaviour and many more skills.

This is a very short 'grab' of the many learning activities happening daily across the school. It's a purposeful and productive programme.

#### Harcourts Foundation's hot donation

The swimming pool committee received an unexpected and welcome donation from the Harcourts Foundation last week, a \$10,000 grant towards the installation of solar heating.

Chris Harvey from Harcourts contacted the school after the recent fire and evacuation to offer support for Wakefield from the Foundation, which has donated nearly six million dollars to communities since it was set up in 2008. In discussion with the Pool Committee the Foundation agreed to make a contribution to a major project that will see solar heating installed, hopefully before next swimming season.

"This is a perfect fit for the Foundation," said Chris. "The pool is a real community asset, it brings people together and supports the health and well-being of Wakefield. We are very pleased to be involved."

**School Payments**

**LOST PROPERTY**

**Where is the lost property box?**

In case you are wondering, the 'lost property' box has moved from the hall to the foyer of room six. The best way to keep children and clothing together is to clearly name: a) the child (mostly that is done), and b) the clothing (almost never done). Handy hint: use the same name for both the child and clothing. The lost property box will be emptied periodically and the contents sent to a clothing bin.

You only need to register once, then its simply a matter of logging in with your email address and password.


## Existing users

There are a number of ways you can choose to top-up your account, and this can be done either at the checkout, or by selecting the 'top up account' option.




**Internet Banking** No fees. Allow 1 day for processing.



## Topping up your online school shop account

We've set up our Kindo online school shop to make it easy for our families to pay for school costs anywhere, anytime. It's open 24/7, and is our preferred method of payment.

There are a number of ways you can top up your account: either from the 'top up account' option, on the banner or under 'mykindo' option.



(All online payments are handled securely through DPS Payment express.)

**Bank Transfer (allow 2 days)** [Get details](#)

Set up regular payments using Bank transfer, so you'll always have funds available when you need them. Fee free!

To view the details for setting up your payments, select the 'Click here' or 'Get details' option. This will give you the bank account details to make the payments into, along with your member number to be included as the reference.

NOTE: this is not recommended for same day/next day lunch orders, as lunch orders will not be processed until funds have cleared.

**Online topup** [Top up now](#)

You can pay-as-you-go using our online top up options – either from the 'top up account' options, or at the checkout. Funds are available instantly using these payment methods.

POLi – you can now also use POLi for a quick and instant transfer. Fee free.

Credit or Debit card – payments are processed in real time. Fee 50 cents plus 2.5%.

*Visa / Mastercard / American Express / China UnionPay available.*

Whatever method you use to top up your Kindo account, you can always just top up the funds you need for the day, or top up a bit more and have a balance available for super speedy checkout next time.


