BEFORE SCHOOL SUPERVISION

We have noticed some children arriving at school very early. Please remember, for their safety and wellbeing, children are not allowed to be at school before 8:15 am unless by prior arrangement. We do understand that sometimes families do have situations that require some flexibility. If you get caught out and need an unusually early drop off or late pick up please make sure you have spoken with one of our staff members and sought their agreement. Equally we ask that families support each other (it takes a village to raise a child) with before and after school care if you can. We also know that the community needs change over time. With this in mind, later in the term we will be putting out a survey to see if there is enough need for a before school care programme to be established.

BULLYING PREVENTION AND RESPONSE

This is the first in a three-part series of information about responding to and preventing bullying at Wakefield School.

Children often talk about feeling "bullied" at school and indeed when bullying occurs it can have long lasting negative impacts. In order to effectively prevent and respond to bullying in our school, it is essential we first understand what bullying is and what it is not.

So what is bullying?

The widely accepted definition of bullying is that it has four distinct characteristics:

- 1. **Bullying is deliberate** *(done to purposely hurt someone)* there is an intention to cause physical and / or psychological pain or discomfort to another person.
- 2. **Bullying involves a power imbalance** (the victim believes the bully / bullies have more power) there is an actual or perceived unequal relationship between the target and the initiator that may be based on physical size, age, gender, social status or digital capability and access.
- 3. **Bullying has an element of repetition** (the same thing happens multiple times or with multiple people) bullying behaviour is usually not one-off. It is repeated over time, with the threat of further incidents leading to fear and anxiety. Repeated acts of bullying may involve single acts with different targets, as well as multiple acts with the same target.
- 4. **Bullying is harmful** (*bullying hurts people*) there is short or long-term physical or psychological harm to the target (eq., as a result of coercion or intimidation).

The bully or bullies are only part of the problem:

- Bullies are usually children who are hurting so much they feel an urge to hurt others.
- Bystanders are people who see bullying behaviour and don't do or say anything. By not doing or saying anything they support the bullying to continue.
- Followers are people who don't start the bullying behaviour but join in or laugh, this encourages the bullying to continue.
- A victim's resilience or lack of resilience has a significant impact on the severity of bullying. One child may be moderately annoyed by one behaviour and another seriously upset by the same behaviour.

What should you do if you think your child or another child is being bullied?

Very often bullying can be very covert behaviour, this means that it is hidden from the adults. Please don't assume we know what has happened or is happening. If you believe your child has been/is being bullied, please make contact with us as soon as you can. This could be making contact with your child's teacher or, if you feel the situation is serious, contacting the principal or one of our deputy principals. Please also encourage your child to speak to a trusted adult at school if they are concerned for themselves or anyone else.

ROAD PATROL

It has been noticed that some parents are choosing to cross the road with children in sight of the road patrol crossing point but not at the crossing, both before and after school. Please help us to reinforce the road safety messages we give your child by always using our road patrol crossing when our children are on road patrol duty.

UPCOMING TEACHER'S UNION MEETING

On **Tuesday 28 February** almost all our teachers will be attending a union meeting. This means we will be **finishing school at 12:45pm** on this day. As our teachers will need to get away very promptly, **if parents arrive after 12:50pm children will be able to be collected from the hall.**

Supervision through to 3pm will be provided for children of families who are unable to make other arrangements. As the union meeting involves almost all our teaching staff, we would appreciate as many families as possible collecting children early. There will be a notification slip on the Skool Loop app for you to complete so that we know how many students we will be supervising. Please contact the office if you need help accessing the Skool Loop app.



Simply login with your email and password and click on the 'Fees and Donations' service to link your students to our school records and view your family account. Click here to log in.


Payment

For an optional item, click on your child's initial next to the item to add it to your cart.








