## SCHOOL CLOSED TOMORROW FOR TEACHERS STRIKE

On **Thursday 16 March** teachers around the country and at Wakefield School are striking because they feel *'the funding for our schools is not sufficient to give teachers and principals the time and resources to teach. More resourcing is needed to ensure that:*

- *all of our tamariki thrive, and*
- *we can retain our quality educators and school leaders in the sector.'*

Please remember tomorrow **Wakefield School is closed for most students** while our teachers are striking.

## YEAR 7 UPDATE

This section of our newsletter will be a regular feature for the rest of this year to keep you all updated with the progress of our Year 7 preparations. We will soon be sending out a survey to families of our Year 6 students to find out which of our students already know they will be staying for Year 7, which are still undecided and which will definitely be moving on to another school in 2024.

Our preparations for Year 7 are continuing to make good progress. We have begun discussing the refurbishment of our learning spaces with the Ministry, this property project will be our greatest priority this year. We are also forming a small team of staff who will be working on exciting projects such as Year 7 camp planning (watch this space) and curriculum design. We are all very excited about the bespoke learning we will be able to offer our Year 7 students and some unique experiences they will be able to enjoy at Wakefield School. At the heart of our curriculum design is the community aspiration for learning that reflects our village and rural school experience and with learning opportunities that are different from the experiences the children will have had up to the end of year 6.

## BULLYING PREVENTION AND RESPONSE

*This is the third in a three part series of information about responding to and preventing bullying at Wakefield School.*

Research shows that schools are most effective at minimising the harm and prevalence of bullying when they effectively implement these elements of bullying prevention and response:

- Everyone has a **clear definition of what bullying is** and what it is not (*refer to part one in the newsletter published on 15 February*).
- Incidents of bullying are addressed through **social problem solving** (such as restorative justice). Social problem solving involves students, parents and whānau working with school staff to create solutions. Such approaches also take the view that support and strategies need to be in place for both the targets and the initiators of bullying.
- Ensuring a **whole-school focus on developing healthy social behaviours** and strategies (rather than only addressing bullying behaviours). This means explicitly teaching and practising social skills.
- Active promotion of a '**safe telling**' culture. A safe telling culture encourages all students to report bullying behaviour (whether they are the target, the initiator, or a bystander of bullying). A safe telling culture also provides students with acknowledgement that they have done the right thing. Ensuring children can confidentially report bullying is an important part of a 'safe telling' culture.

### **What should you do if you think your child or another child is being bullied?**

Very often bullying can be very covert behaviour, this means that it is hidden from the adults. Please don't assume we know what has happened or is happening. If you believe your child has been/is being bullied, please make contact with us as soon as you can. This could be making contact with your child's teacher or, if you feel the situation is serious, contacting the principal or one of our deputy principals. Please also encourage your child to speak to a trusted adult at school if they are concerned for themselves or anyone else.

## NO PARKING ZONE REMINDER

Please remember that parking on either side of the road adjacent to our bus bay on Edward Street is not permitted from 8:30am - 9:30am and 2:30pm - 3:30pm. This is because the buses need the space to manoeuvre into the bus bay. Please take care to park elsewhere at these times.




## PAY IT FORWARD

- Kindo – You can add additional donations to your account via your Kindo account.


