










#### YEAR 7 UPDATE

Next week on **Wednesday 5 April at 4pm** we will be holding a **Year 6 parents meeting** to share with you the work we have completed this term and the upcoming projects we have in term 2 as we get ready for our first Year 7 intake. After this meeting we will be sending out a survey to get initial 2024 intentions for our Year 6 students. If you, a family member or a friend would like to help us out on a regular or a casual basis, please get in touch with the school office.




#### **BEFORE SCHOOL SUPERVISION**


Recently we sent out a before school care survey to gauge whether or not there is a need for before school supervision to be provided at school. This would work the same as after school care options where parents would have to pay for children to be supervised at school. Currently we do not offer any out of hours supervision and children are allowed to be onsite without parent supervision from 8:15am.

As you can see in the following graphs, the responses to the survey suggest there is sufficient interest for us to look into onsite before school supervision.

While we look into options for before school care and the costs attached to this, we will be asking all children who arrive before the buses (8:15am) to wait outside rooms 14 & 15 (next to the office). This is so we can ensure their safety without creating additional work for teachers. It is very important that before 8:15 am, teachers are free to complete their preparations for the school day without interruptions from our students. We ask any parents whose children are likely to be arriving at school before 8:15 am, to remind their children to wait outside the office until the first bus has arrived at school. Thank you so much for supporting us with this new expectation.

It is an opportunity for you to meet parents of other children starting school, and hear ways you can help your child have a smooth transition.



For an optional item, click on your child's initial next to the item to add it to your cart.




