In the last two weeks our students have been great representatives for our school. We are super proud of our Cross Country team. These students competed at the inter-school cross country event with outstanding achievements, mīharo! Not only did we achieve some fantastic individual results our whole school team placed 2nd (based on lowest average finisher time) among all the schools in our sports cluster. In addition to this we had some outstanding year group team placings. These placings are awarded to the school teams with the lowest average time for the students' top four places:



Year 5 and under girls:1st Wakefield - 4.25 Year 5 and under boys: 3rd Wakefield - 10.25 Year 6 girls: 2nd Wakefield - 8.5 Year 6 boys: 1st Wakefield - 7.5




