YEAR 7 UPDATE

Our next Year 7&8 information meeting for parents and caregivers will be held Wednesday 16 August at 6pm in the school library.

Towards the end of last term, we sent home our prospectus with our Year 6 students and ran a student information session. Thank you to everyone who completed our intentions survey. At this stage we are expecting to start with 20-25 Year 7 students from Wakefield. It is still likely that we will also pick up some additional students from other schools.

Our work continued over the holiday break and we have now appointed Onus as the company to design and deliver our property projects over the coming months. The final step is to have the Ministry of Education approve of our budget and proposed projects. We are very excited to begin the design process.

This term will also see us purchasing a large number of resources and start making some decisions around furniture. We are excited to have our Year 7 & 8 learning spaces beginning to take shape.

Regional Primary School Cross Country Championship

We sent a team of 27 runners to this event which was held on the last day of Term 2 at Rabbit Island. They had all been training at school for this event, putting in a lot of work and I was super proud of them.

LIBRARY


The 5th Scholastic book Club brochure is out. These need to be returned to the office by Thursday 27th July. Please make sure you write your child's full name and room number on the form.
