NUDE FOOD CHALLENGE

Next week we are going to be launching a "Nude Food" challenge with our students. The purpose of this challenge is to encourage our children and families to think about the simple changes that you can make to reduce waste and cost when preparing nutritious lunches for school. "Nude Food" means replacing prepackaged food with bulk bought or homemade items that are brought to school in reusable packaging. Some ideas to help are:

Instead of	You could try
Small packets of chips, nuts or crackers	Buy a large packet and put a few in a reusable container each day.
Individually wrapped snack bars	Homemade or unpackaged muesli bars, bliss balls or slices
Small packets of popcorn	Make your own popcorn and send it to school in a reusable container
Yoghurt pottles or suckies	A small reusable container of yoghurt with a spoon (hot tip - something with a screw top lid is best to avoid spills)
Some other easy ideas	

- Hard boiled egg
- Cheese cubes/slices
- Veggie sticks and a small container of dip/hummus
- Small pieces of fruit (cut up sometimes makes this more appealing)
- Sandwiches
- Wraps
- Mini muffins
- Mini quiche/bacon & egg pie made in muffin tins
- Japanese style rice balls/sushi

WAKEFIELD SCHOOL GALA

For those who are new to Wakefield School: The PTA and Board of Trustees run a gala each year as the major fundraising event.

It takes several months and many hours work for the gala team with planning, collecting, sorting, cooking, sourcing sponsors, manning stalls, set up and clean up. HOW YOUR CHILD CAN GET INVOLVED

In the lead up to the gala, and on the day, there are several ways that your child can get directly involved and we will share more on this over the coming weeks and months.

- 1. **Poster/Picture Competition -** The first opportunity will be with our Gala Poster/Picture Competition. In a few weeks your child will bring home a poster template. We would love to see their fantastic artwork displayed advertising the school gala. All completed artwork will go into the draw for some fantastic prizes. These children's winning posters will be enlarged and photocopied to be put on display. And of course, you can photocopy your child's poster and stick it up anywhere you can think of to help us advertise our event.
- 2. Weekly Draw By dropping off donations of books, clothes, garage sale items, plants, soft toys or items to make up mystery bags, your child will get their name entered into our weekly draw. Friday 18th: Whole School Lit Quiz 2:00 – 3:00pm in hall







NBS SPONSORS FREE SWIMMING LESSONS FOR 140 SCHOOL CHILDREN IN NELSON TASMAN REGION

NBS, in collaboration with CLM, is proud to announce the sponsorship of two terms of free-swimming lessons for 140 school children across the Nelson-Tasman region. The initiative aims to provide invaluable opportunities for children who may not have had access to swimming tuition due to financial constraints.

As an island nation surrounded by oceans, lakes, and rivers, swimming is a fundamental skill and a national rite of passage in New Zealand. However, the country has unfortunately experienced high rates of drowning, largely due to limited access to swimming education. 


